3:00 - 4:00 PM	Results of Assumable Waters Federal Advisory Committee In a 2014 letter to U.S. EPA, three state associations requested the EPA to provide clarity on the question of over which waters a state or tribe may assume Clean Water Act section 404 permitting authority. In response, and for the purpose of making recommendations to EPA on how the agency might provide such
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	clarity, EPA established the Assumable Waters Subcommittee under NACEPT and in accordance with the Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA). In June 2016, The Assumable Waters Subcommittee to the National Advisory Council for Environmental Policy and Technology (NACEPT) official submitted their final report to Administrator Pruitt for consideration. The Subcommittee came to a majority and minority set of recommendations, with all members but the USACE agreeing to the majority recommendations.
