MEASURING PROGRESS – IMPLICATIONS OF NEW AGENCY METRICS (CONT.) CORE MEASURES

Over the last year EPA been focusing on continuous improvement through the identification and solving of problems at the levels closest to the work. EPA Lean Management System (ELMS) sets ambitious performance measure targets and tracks progress against them to find and solve small problems before they become big problems. OW's currently has 143 different program measures but has a set out to streamline this list and to a core set of optimized measures that can be used to support ELMS, OW's budget requests, and the National Water Program Guidance process.
