Regulatory Action



- The NPDES eRule was developed in close coordination with the Environmental Council of States (ECOS) and the Association of Clean Water Agencies (ACWA). The final rule was published on 22 October 2015.
- It requires that NPDES regulated entities electronically submit the following permit and compliance monitoring information:
 - Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs)
 - Notices of Intent to discharge in compliance with a general permit; and
 - Program reports.
- The rule does not increase the amount of information NPDES regulated facilities are required to submit.
- It also requires that authorized NPDES programs electronically submit NPDES program data to EPA.

Goals of the Rulemaking



This final rule helps EPA and states clean up the nation's waters by:


- Shifting from paper to electronic reporting.
- Saving time and resources for the regulated community and for states that can be shifted to other program areas.
- Improving transparency, which serves to elevate the importance of data and environmental performance.
- Using technology to obtain more accurate, timely, complete, and consistent information about the NPDES program.

Scope of NPDES eRule: NPDES-Regulated Entities





Federal Biosolids Annual Reports (EPA Biosolids Center of Excellence, Region 7)

Achieving Goals





- There is a dramatic increase in the use of NetDMR since promulgation of the 2015 NPDES Electronic Reporting Rule.
- This trend will continue as more and more facilities are trained and registered with NetDMR.
- States are also making tremendous progress in transitioning DMR filers to state electronic reporting tools.



NPDES eRule Readiness and Data Completeness Dashboard



Released in ECHO Gov for state use in Nov 2016.

• Gives states and Regions opportunity to review, comment, and qualify.



- The eRule includes two phases over a five-year period (Dec 2015 Dec 2020).
- Phase 1: Dec 2015 to Dec 2016, includes:
 - DMRs and the Sewage Sludge/Biosolids Annual Program Report (in 42 states where EPA implements the Federal Biosolids Program) from permittees
 - Facility/Permit Data, inspections, violation determination, and enforcement actions from authorized agencies
- Phase 2: Dec 2016 to Dec 2020, includes:
 - Begin electronically collecting remaining set of NPDES program information (e.g., general permit reports, CAFO Annual Program Reports, MS4 Reports, Pretreatment Program Reports, Sewer Overflow/Bypass Events Reports)
 - Each authorized state agency submitted a Phase 2 implementation plan to EPA for review and comment.

Phase 2 Implementation



- EPA received Phase 2 Implementation Plans (IPs) from all states. Thank you! We provided comments and will post the final plans on our website (www.epa.gov/compliance/npdes-ereporting) as discussed in the preamble to the final rule.
- EPA used the Phase 2 IPs to identify states that would like to use EPA's electronic reporting tools (NetDMR, NeT). EPA is working closely with these states to deploy electronic general permit forms and program reports in a staggered fashion.
- EPA is using web-services to deploy these forms along with a strong commitment to outreach and training resources.

Continuous Collaboration with Authorized Agencies



- EPA and states are collaborating via technical workgroups to define the reference values, business rules, and other data standards for the minimum set of NPDES program data (Appendix A to 40 CFR 127).
- Current or planned workgroups include:
 - Pretreatment Program (started March 2017, close to completion)
 - Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (started March 2017, close to completion)
 - NPDES general permits (started June 2017, will be on-going through Phase 2 implementation).
 - CWA Section 316(a) & (b) (November 2017)
 - Construction, Industrial, and Urban Stormwater (November 2017)
- Past workgroups that met their objectives include:
 - Biosolids (March August 2016)
 - Sewer Overflows and POTW-specific Data (September 2016 February 2017)
 - Core NPDES Tracking Data (December 2016 February 2017)


The output from these workgroups are implementation guides that are being posted on the **NPDES eReporting public website** after final EPA and state review.



Overview of NNCR Due 21 December 2021



- EPA HQ staff are working with EPA regional and state staff to develop the NPDES Noncompliance Report (NNCR) and a related project to develop a new draft tool to prioritize serious NPDES noncompliance.
- EPA will need to ensure that the NNCR has the data necessary to support any new noncompliance scoring/sorting tools developed.
