AFOs in NC – Permitting

- State Permits 2,236 total
- NPDES Permits 17 total


- General Permits
- Individual Permits



NC Permitting Threshold NC General Statute 143-215.10B

- 250 or more swine
- 100 or more confined cattle
- 75 or more horses
- 30,000 or more poultry with a liquid waste management system
- All Others Deemed/Permitted by Rule
 - 15A NCAC 02T .1303






AFOs in North Carolina by type

- Permitted Facilities
 - Swine 2069 permits (~ 3300 lagoons)
 - Cattle 159 permits (~ 200 waste structures)
 - Wet Poultry 18 permits / 7 active (32 lagoons)
 - Others 7 facilities
- Deemed Permitted
 - Dry Litter Poultry unknown*







Storm History Issues Faced

- Lagoon Capacity
 - Discharge/Overtopping
 - Structural Integrity
- Inundation
- Structural Damage
- Crop Loss
- Mortality
- Access
- Debris



Storm HistorySwine Buyout Program

Voluntary conservation easements for swine operations in 100year floodplain to reduce risk to water quality from future flood events

- 43 farms and 106 lagoons closed to date
 - Phase 1 1999; 17 farms
 - Phase 2 2002; 18 farms
 - Phase 3 2004; 5 farms
 - Phase 4 2007; 3 farms
 - Phase 5 2018; still in process




Hurricane Florence Lagoon Performance



- Over 900 facilities reported in
- Structural Damage
 - 6 Facilities 6 lagoons
- Discharge Overtopped
 - 28 Facilities 32 lagoons
- Inundated
 - 7 Facilities 9 lagoons
- Freeboard 0-3"
 - 18 Facilities 20 lagoons at 0"
 - 32 Facilities 40 lagoons 0-3"





















Hurricane Florence Mortality Management

- NCDA&CS Veterinary Division
- Livestock losses
 - 5,500 swine
 - 4.5 Million poultry
- Mortality Management
 - Landfill
 - Rendering
 - Burial
 - Composting poultry



Hurricane Florence Bermuda Window

- Bermuda Window extension
- Issued by NCDA&CS Agronomic Division
- Extended to Oct 20
 - Based on stand of bermuda and on weather forecast

- No additional PAN
- No blanket extensions on other crops



Hurricane Florence Reporting Requirements




- DWR waived 5-Day POA requirement
- Include in 30-Day POA
- Discharges include overtopped and inundated
 - Self Report required
 - Press Release
 - Public Notice
 - Source Samples



- NCDA&CS Div. of Soil & Water Conservation
- Buy-out Program
- Incentives Program
 - Pasture Renovation
 - Winter Forage
 - Lagoon Management
