
# **2021 National Pretreatment Virtual Coregulator Meeting**

# SESSION 2: COMBINED WASTE STREAMS: DEFINITIONS, FORMULAS, AND TOOLS

EPA has drafted a Combined Wastestream Formula Worksheet to guide the industrial user permit writer when calculating alternative categorical limits. EPA is requesting comments from States on the worksheet's usefulness, format, and clarity. Ultimately, this Worksheet is proposed to be an addendum to the 1985 <u>Guidance Manual for the Use of Production-Based Pretreatment Standards and the Combined Wastestream Formula</u> and the 2012 <u>Industrial User Permitting Guidance Manual</u>, and will be formally launched via a training webinar
