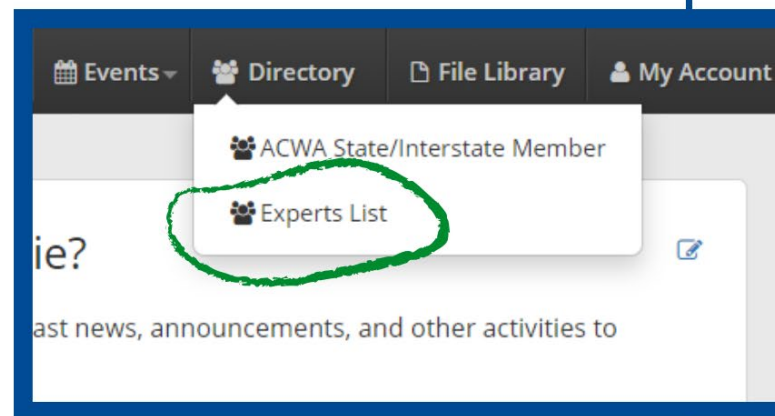

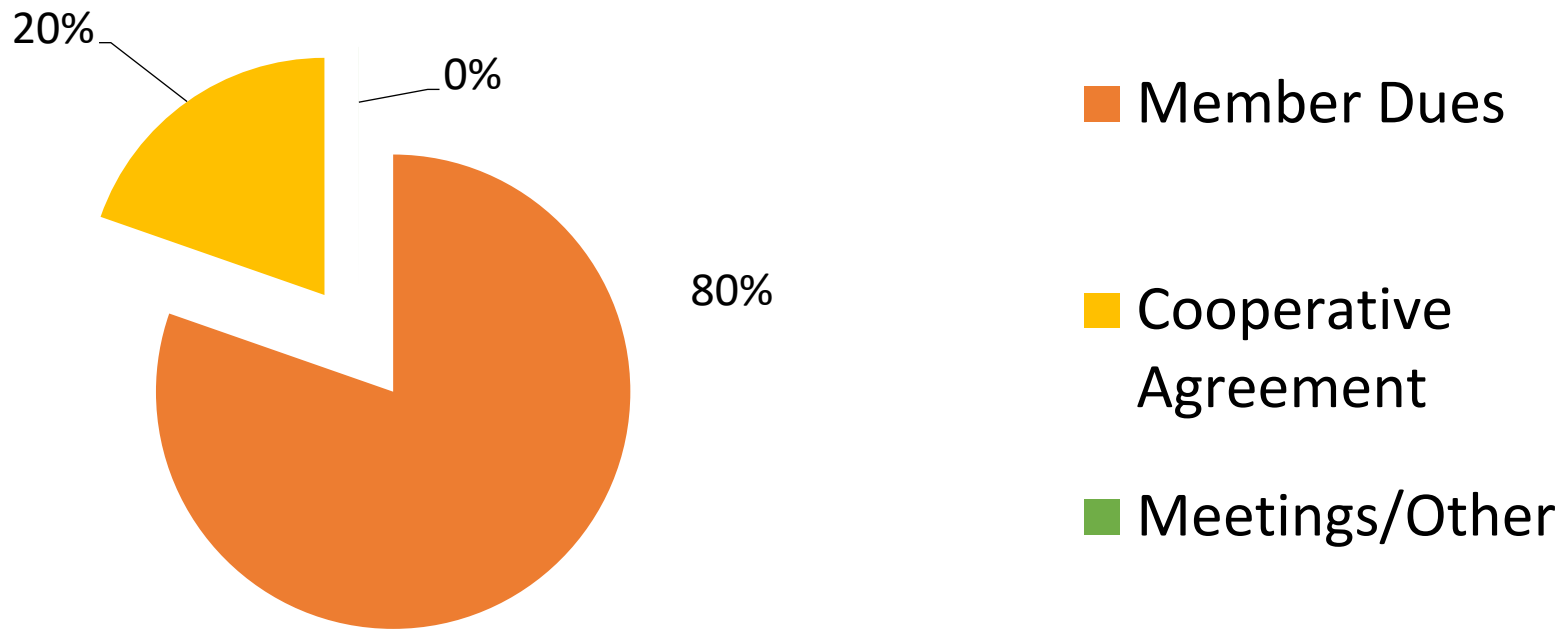

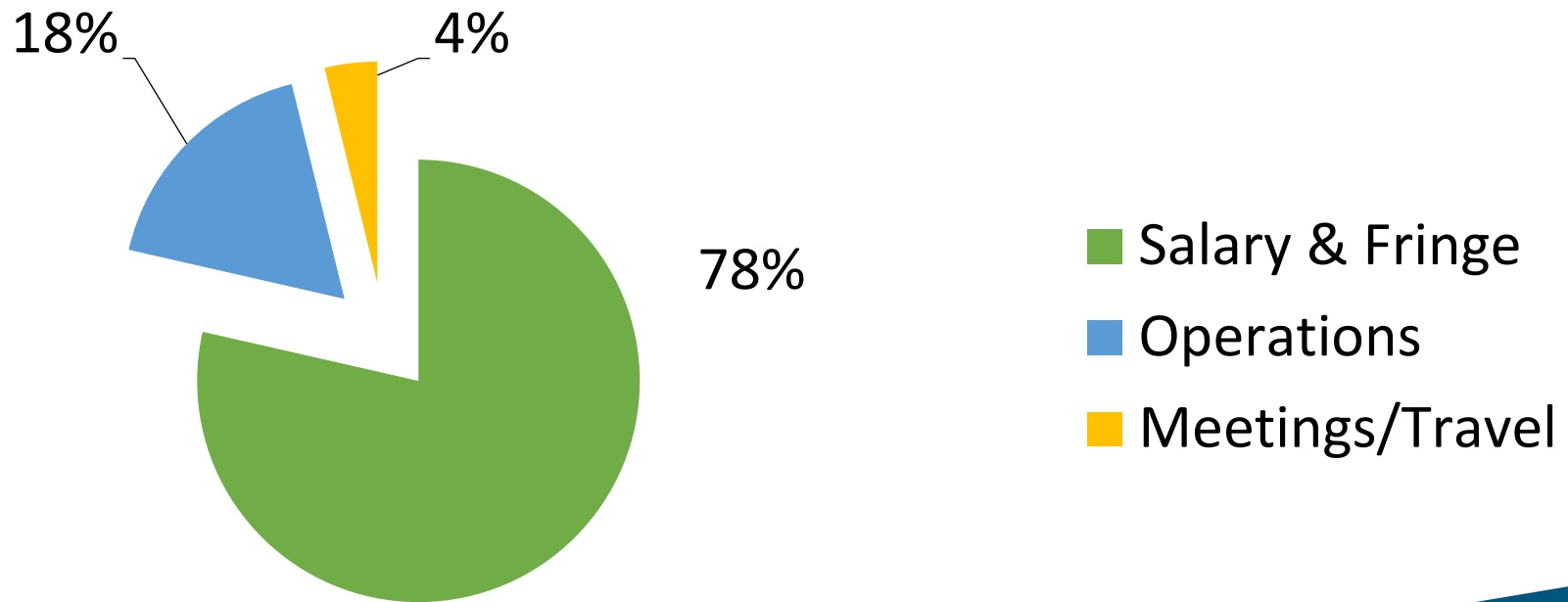

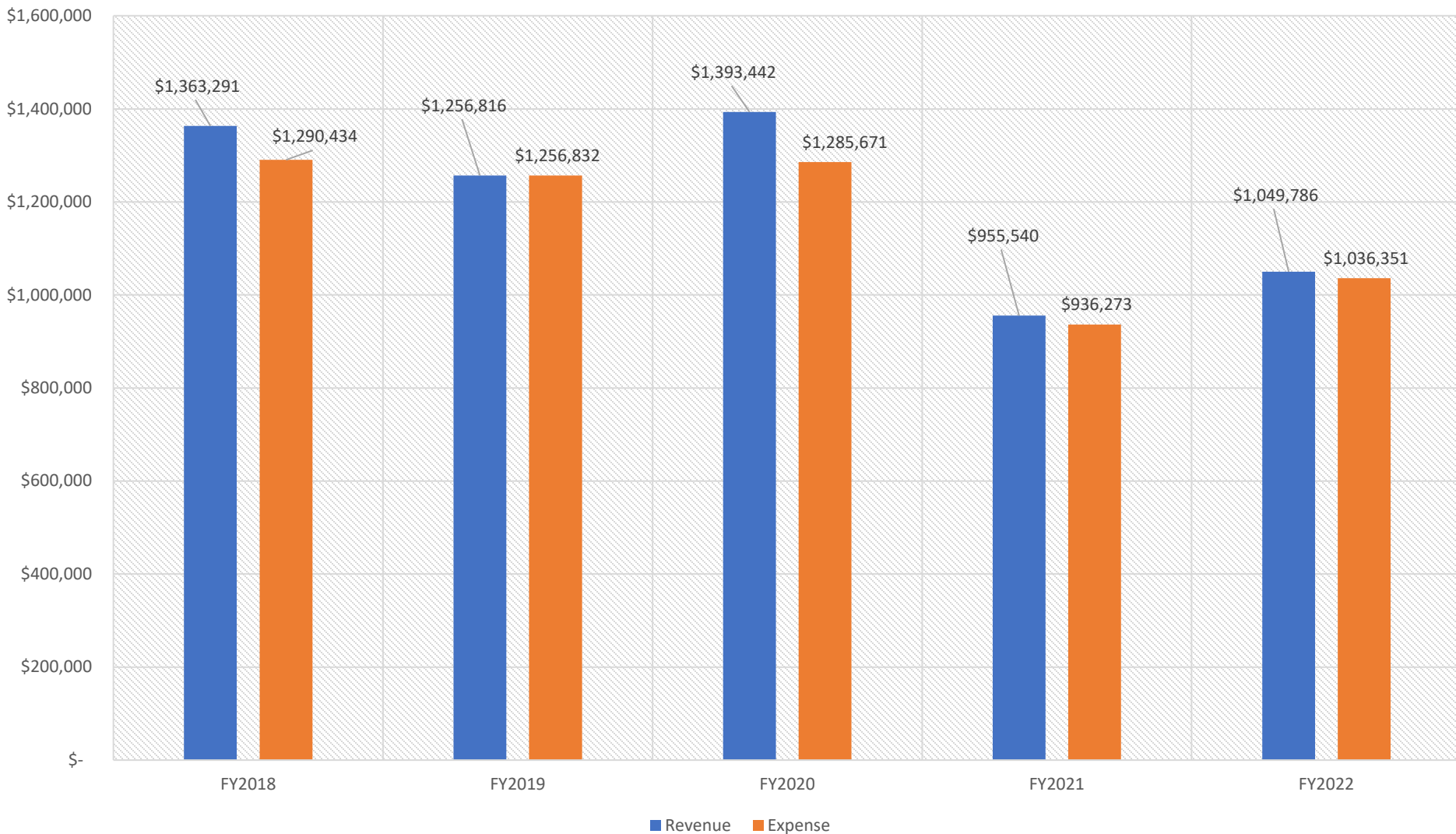
FY2022 Revenue - \$1,049,786 (unaudited)
