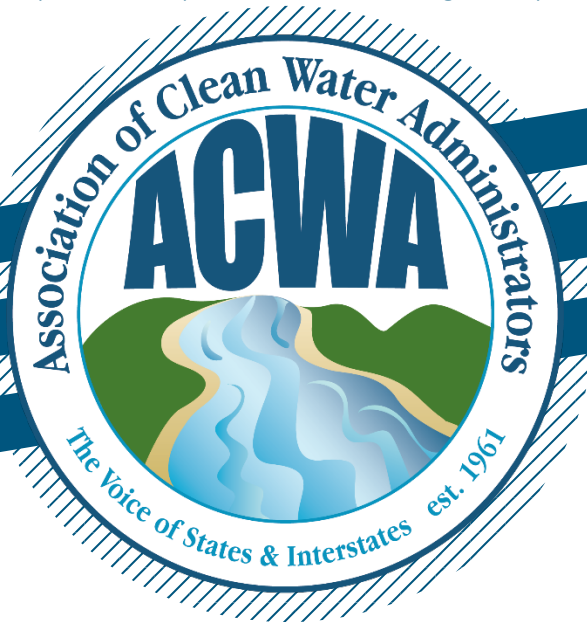
### **PURPOSE**
