Electronic Permitting -



- TCEQ receives and processes thousands of registrations and permit applications each year.
 - Created the ePermits system to automate the process of creating and managing authorizations, registrations, and permits.
- The State of Texas Environmental Electronic Reporting System (STEERS) is a vehicle to collect data electronically.
 - Provides a common framework and security for multiple agency programs that enable the regulated entities to submit permits and registrations electronically.
 - Meets EPA CROMERR requirements and requires users to establish an account and an electronic signature.





Why Was It Developed?

- ePermits is actually two separate systems and the main reason to develop the system was two-fold:
 - Internally it allows staff to create and maintain electronic applications and data.
 - Externally it allows customers to select, complete, and submit an electronic application.
- ePermits includes two stormwater general permits
 - CGP available March 2008 and mandatory September 2018
 - MSGP available August 2011 and mandatory September 2017
 - Note: Phase II MS4 General Permit applications are not submitted in ePermits
- The ePermits system allows TCEQ to process a high volume of applications (NOIs, NOCs, NOTs) in a timely fashion.

What Programs are in ePermits?

- ePermits was created to serve for users to:
 - Create New Authorizations
 - Modify Existing Authorizations
 - Renew Authorizations
 - Terminate Authorizations
 - Share/Access In-Progress Authorizations
 - View Application documents including authorization Certificates and Letters





Key Features of ePermits

- Strictly follows Signature Authority Standards in federal and state rules
- One time account set up and authenticated sessions
- Seamless permit application process for any program type or general permit type
- Guided Task list details each section that needs to be entered by the user
- Copy information from an existing application with minimal data entry
- Help links to complete the application in a single session
- Customer Validations and potential duplicate checks
- Compliance History and Delinquent Fees validation
- Efficient search functionality and filtering techniques



Challenges

User Characteristics

- Internet availability and customers' ability to use computers.
- Customers are expected to have some knowledge of the program areas they use.
- STEERS Participation Agreement (SPA) requires a valid Texas drivers license

Data Integrity

- Data is directly entered by the customer. The customer has a vested interest in entering the data correctly in the system.
- Data must meet several minimum validation standards before it can be submitted to the agency.
- Customer Validations against Secretary of State and Comptrollers databases.



Challenges

- Application specific:
 - Missing site information or incorrect site addresses.
 - Customers wait until the last minute to renew their applications.
 - Failure to login successfully locks the account.
 - Role based access preparer versus signatory.



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Present and Future

- Electronic Reporting Rule and General Permits
 - All applications for general permits need to be submitted electronically
- 2021 Multi-Sector General Permit
 - As of Sept. 1, 2017, requires that all applications be submitted electronically
 - Only received a small number of paper applications with a valid electronic waiver
- 2018 Construction General Permit
 - As of Sept. 1, 2018, requires that all applications be submitted electronically
 - Only received a small number of paper applications with a valid electronic waiver
- Stormwater Processing Center
 - Less paper applications to process
 - More time is required on customer service to assist customers using ePermits
 - Focusing on data cleanup



Sharing Data with EPA

- Data from the permits submitted in the ePermits system (by both applicants directly and staff entering paper applications) is shared with EPA's Integrated Compliance Information System (ICIS) database
- Data is pushed to ICIS using the Texas Integrated Data Exchange Node (TIDEN)
 - Data is sent to ICIS nightly
 - Staff manually push data from Notice of Change applications



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New eReporting Progress


- As of April 1, 2022, all MSGP monitoring data must be submitted electronically in NetDMR
- Delegation of Signatories Submitted in STEERS
 - All MSGP permittees must submit delegation of signatories electronically as of August 14, 2021
 - All large construction site operators will be required to submit delegation of signatories electronically as of March 5, 2023
- Phase II MS4 Applications and Reports will be submitted in EPA's NeT-MS4 system in 2024
 - Due to complexity of MS4 applications and TCEQ resource demands, TCEQ is opting now to use EPA's system rather than implement this program in the STEERS/ePermits system






