# Mission WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

DIVISION OF MONITORING, STANDARDS & PESTICIDE CONTROL

DWMSPC oversees pesticide regulation and assesses NJ's waters to ensure drinking water, recreational activities, shellfish harvesting, and aquatic health comply with regulations.

DIVISION OF WATER SUPPLY & GEOSCIENCE

DWSG works to ensure New Jersey's drinking water supply is adequate, reliable, safe, and available for the future, based on sound science.



DIVISION OF WATER QUALITY

DWQ has the primary responsibility for protecting New Jersey's surface and ground waters from pollution caused by improperly treated wastewater and its residuals.

DIVISION OF WATER ENFORCEMENT

DWE ensures compliance with the State's water programs. Their focus is placed on inspections of wastewater discharge, community drinking water supply facilities and stormwater management.






# Water Infrastructure Investment Plan

New Jersey's Water Bank program will receive almost \$1 billion from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law over the next five years. New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to make transformative investments in critical water infrastructure upgrades. These WIIP sessions focus on how the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection expects to use these funds through the clean water and drinking water state revolving funds (SRFs). #### Suggested Conditions for CSO Permits

New permits will contain specific permit conditions for the next five-year permit cycle that will reflect unique elements of each permittee's respective LTCP. These new permits will also contain general provisions that will apply across all permittees. For each category below, charge questions have been provided to solicit feedback to guide stakeholder discussions.

For each suggestion, please identify the issue of concern within the context of the suggested permit condition and why this suggestion will help address that issue. Once DWQ collects this information, future stakeholder meetings will be scheduled.

# **CSO Public Engagement**

Starting in 2021, DWQ began a series of stakeholder engagement to develop new permit conditions and develop guidance for public engagement.

Survey responses were used to develop agendas and discussion items for stakeholder meetings.

#### What the CSO Permit Can Require Under the Clean Water Act

- Designation of a CSO coordinator for public engagement and have based on various design phases (planning/design/implementation) with a contact for major construction projects;
- Permittee should have a website as an information platform to provide connection between the public & permittee and public signage identifying LTCP projects;
- Permittee must advertise meetings in advance with locations, times and agendas;
- Restart the CSO Supplemental Team with a request for new members representing different groups;
- Permittee must select meeting locations that are accessible to the local community with meeting materials in other languages.
- Require a Regional level CSO Supplemental Team as well as Municipal teams (at the community level).

#### What the CSO Permit Does Not Have Regulatory Authority to Require

- Permittees to fund community groups to do public outreach;
- Establish methods to prove that outreach efforts will result in engagement from the affected community.




#### Overview of Some Permit Conditions Developed as a Result of Public Input Throughout the LTCP Implementation

- ✓ CSO Executive Summary A one-page non-technical summary
  of the highlights of the CSO permit.
- ✓ Enhanced Public Engagement Requires meetings held with public accessibility; posted in advance; website as information clearinghouse; requires CSO Coordinator.
- ✓ Environmental Justice Continue to identify and focus on addressing CSO-related flooding areas.
- Green Infrastructure Inclusion of additional GI projects will not require modification of the LTCP; require installation of GI early in the LTCP implementation; encourage public input on locations of GI.
